

And whereas Governments are instituted for securing the unalienable Rights of Man, and the protection of Individuals in the Enjoyment of Life, Liberty, and Property; and all government originates from the People, is found in Compact only, and intended solely for the Good of the whole. And whereas it is expressly declared by our own Bill of Rights, "That whenever the Ends of Government are perverted, and public Liberty manifestly endangered, the People may, and of Right ought, to establish a new, or reform the old Government": From which, as well as from the Nature of Society and the Principles of Government, it appears that the People have, at all Times, an Inherent Right to alter and amend the Form of Government, in such Manner as may appear to them best adapted to the End proposed.

And whereas it has been found from Experience, that the great and important Ends of Government are not effected by our present Form of Government; and that the general Departments thereof are so blended together, and improperly arranged, as to prevent an impartial, beneficial, and energetic operation.


